



Easter Clay Decorations

A simple step-by-step guide



What you'll need:

Polymer coloured clay that you don't need to paint but requires baking:

- [Sculpey Premo Classics 12 Pack](#)
- [Cernit Tool Kit 8 Piece](#)
- [Uniti Wooden Palette & Brush Set 12 Pack](#)
- [Mod Podge Glosss 236ml Clear](#)
- [WS Kraft Paper Roll](#)

Air dry clay (no baking needed) that you can paint:

Step-by-Step Instructions

1 Prepare your workspace



Lay down craft paper and gather all your materials.

2 Condition the clay



Slice small pieces and knead until soft and smooth.

3 Shape your designs



Create small Easter figures such as bunnies, eggs, and chicks. Use tools or toothpicks to add details.

4 Prepare for baking



Place pieces on baking paper on a tray, spaced apart.

5 Bake the clay

Temperature: 130°C (265°F). Time: 15–30 minutes (approx. 15 mins per 6mm thickness). Check your clay packaging for exact instructions. If using air-dry clay, skip baking.

6 Paint your creations



Once cooled, decorate with acrylic paints.

7 Seal for shine & durability



Apply a thin coat of Mod Podge and let dry.

Optional Extras

- Add magnet backing for fridge decorations.
- Attach string to hang as Easter ornaments.

Tips

- Keep pieces small for faster baking.
- Work on a clean surface to avoid dust.
- Let items cool fully before painting.
